# **General Meeting—Tuesday 13th September**

Our vice-chairman, Bruce, welcomed everyone back after the summer break. As a mark of respect on the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II on 8<sup>th</sup> September, a minute's silence was held and an expression of sympathy, written by Enid, was read out.

Our speaker, Roy Smart, was then introduced to the meeting and spoke to us on 'Wallis Simpson and the Abdication Crisis' 1936 – Three Kings in One Year. We were entertained with a wonderful presentation and learnt many interesting facts about Wallis Simpson from her early life through to when she fled for France followed by Edward, who 'couldn't live without his love' and signed the Abdication Statement on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> December 1936. The presentation also contained music of the era. It was interesting to learn that the British newspapers remained silent during this period – what a different time we live in now!

## TRAVEL NEWS - 2023 DAY TRIPS

**Thursday 20th April - Royal Botanical Gardens.** The price will be £45 per person and will include Dews coach to London and admission. For those interested in going a deposit of £10 will be required at the October meeting. Payments can be made in cash or, preferably, by bank transfer. A group tour option will be considered if sufficient interest.

Thursday 6th July—Houses of Parliament & Thames River Cruise. Booking for HoP cannot be made until November but the price should be approximately £55 per member. This will include Dews coach to London, tour of the Houses of Parliament and river cruise up to Greenwich. A sign-up sheet will be available at the September meeting but deposits won't be taken until we can confirm prices.
