APRIL AGM MEETING

The Ramsey & District u3a AGM took place at the start of the meeting and after welcoming everyone, the various officers gave their reports. The Treasurer advised that we were in a good financial position and the annual subscription would remain at £17 per member. The admission for the monthly general meeting would be reduced to £1 per member and £2 per visitor. Membership was now at 208 and already over 70% of members had renewed their subscriptions. Thanks were given to Maureen, who resigned during the year. Those committee members staying on were re-elected by a show of hands. Two new members, Viv Carr and Rita Aggarwal were elected and welcomed to the committee. Hazel advised everyone that she would step-down once Brendan was happy in the position of Treasurer. Formal closure of the AGM was declared.

Bruce then introduced our speaker for the day, Peter Tatum, who was visiting us from Haverhill u3a to talk about The Fens and Fenmen. There was a slight mix-up with speakers as Peter had arrived a month early, but Alison and Val from the Neighbourhood Trust were very understanding and offered to come and talk to us in May.

Peter's passion is walking and during his walks he came across the Fen Rivers Way, which created an interest in all things to do with the Fens. We heard about the many people who originated in the Fens, including Hereward the Wake. Wisbech was once on the edge of The Wash but due to silting, it is now 10 miles inland. There were photos of the Holme Post showing how the land has shrunk since this post was originally put in, showing how far below sea level the Fens are sinking. Draining of the Fens has been going on since 1487 culminating in the Denver Sluice being built by Cornelius Vermuyden in 1651, and being rebuilt in 1834. It was reconstructed in 1982-86 and is a major contributor in keeping the Fens drained.

Peter retold many stories of strange happenings in The Fens from *Mucky Porter and the Grey Goose Feather* and *Shady Meg, The Burning Witch*. A most interesting afternoon completed with tea/coffee, biscuits and good conversation.

Wroxham Barns & Great Yarmouth - Thursday 4th July - £24pp (£10 non-refundable deposit. Balance due by 12th June)

We will leave from the Ramsey Clock at 8am and should arrive at Wroxham Barns between 10-10.30am. This is a leisure and shopping complex with boutiques, craft studios, as well as a kids' farm, funfair and restaurant. At 12.30 we will leave to continue on to Great Yarmouth where you can enjoy fish & chips, two piers, funfairs, beautiful gardens along the promenade, a model village and so much more before we return home at 3.30pm.

We will leave from the Ramsey Clock at 8am for our journey to the National Memorial Arboretum. An Act of Remembrance service takes place each day at 10.50am in the Millennium Chapel for FREE for those who want to attend. Otherwise you will be able to explore in your own way. There are a wide variety of cafes and restaurants for you to enjoy drinks and lunch, or you can take your own picnic to eat in the beautiful grounds. Return to the coach for 4 pm to journey home to Ramsey.
